## **PROGRAM NOTES**

**The Kraken** is a mythical sea creature said to be off the coast of Norway. It was probably a giant squid and legends say it could envelope entire ships. This setting is based on "The Kraken," by Mike Kallenberger. Beware, for few who see it live to tell the tale.

Erick Lichte, director of Vancouver's Chor Lioni, has crafted a rollicking arrangement of the traditional New Years song, **Auld Lang Syne**. This arrangement harkens back to its Scottish roots with a vibrant violin and percussion scattered throughout the ensemble. You might need to see the translation because the dialect is so prominently featured in this arrangement.

2024 marked the passing of Peter Schickele, aka P.D.Q. Bach. The New York Times obituary wrote that Schickele was "an American composer whose career as a writer of serious concert music was often eclipsed by that of his antic alter ego, the thoroughly debauched, terrifyingly prolific and mercifully fictional P.D.Q. Bach." **The Art of the Ground Round** is a brief insight into the wry sense of humor that marked more than 50 years of musical mayhem.

Stephen Sondheim was known for such popular Broadway shows as *West Side Story* (Lyricist) and *Into the Woods* (Composer and Lyricist). His knack for crafting catchy text with haunting melodies is evident in these two selections on relationships between adults and children. **Children Will Listen** is a cautionary tale that words do indeed matter. Not While I'm Around is a delightful interplay between guardian and teenager that have shared care of each other.

**Riders in the Sky** has been recorded by more than 40 artists ranging from Johnny Cash and Burl Ives to the Blues Brothers. The melody hauntingly shadows the tune, *When Johnny Comes Marching Home*. Its iconic "Yipee-yi-ay" is sure to bring a smile and get your toes tapping.

From composer Donte Ross: The inspiration for **One** was a little bit of my life mixed in with the story behind my colleague, Spencer Nash's, short film script. The main character is interrogating a hostage and realizes they are in similar situations. They have both lost loved ones and find solace in communicating with each other. It was a hard concept to put into a song, but I can only hope it conveys that sadness and emotion.

Originally composed for SATB choir, this setting of **Even When He is Silent** has a density that embraces dissonances when arranged for the TTBB ensemble. There are three separate ideas in this text as the poet explores hope, love and faith. From the composer: "It has been speculated that the text was found written on a wall at a concentration camp after World War 2. Knowing what that person went through, it makes the words so powerful."

Spirited, a 2022 Christmas movie starring Ryan Reynolds and Will Ferrell, only includes the song **Ripple** in the closing credits. YouTube searches reveal it originally had a broader focus for inclusion in the movie. It is a catchy melody with a delightful message of taking action for positive change. Let's see how far a ripple goes!
